



NEBOSH National General Certificate

The National Examination Board in Occupational Safety and Health (NEBOSH) awarding body is aimed at professionals and managers who have a specified responsibility for health and safety in the workplace.

NEBOSH qualifications are recognised and respected by employers in all sectors of the economy.

Aim of the Programme

The aim of the NEBOSH National General programme is to provide delegates with a general understanding of Occupational Health and Safety and its implications for their organisation.

This programme is suitable for Managers, Supervisors, Employee Representatives and others wishing to gain underpinning knowledge in occupational safety & health. The programme is suitable for non-specialists in occupational health and safety.

Programme Objectives

- Identify hazards and unsafe practices
- Advise on, or to take appropriate remedial action in order to reduce the risks in the working environment
- Use proactive strategies to prevent accidents and control risk
- Identify the main requirements of health and safety legislation
- Select appropriate safety monitoring techniques

Programme Content

The programme is divided into two areas: the management of safety and health and controlling workplace hazards, covering the following topics:

- Hazards and safe systems of work
- Fire prevention measures and actions
- Controlling health hazards
- Methods of controlling risks
- Effective communication
- Investigation of accidents and incidents
- Maintenance of accident records
- Compliance with general legislation

Delegates will be expected to complete course assignments and conduct private study whilst on the programme.

Assessment

Assessment is by an end examination comprising two written papers (Paper NGC1 – Management of Health & Safety and Paper NGC2 - Controlling Workplace Hazards) and a practical assessment (NGC3 – Health and Safety Practical Applications).

Certification

NEBOSH will award certification upon successful completion of the written papers and practical assessments.
